Yakov N. Rabinovich. Personalities of the Time of Troubles: Boris Nikiforovich Davydov.

Summary: The article presents a detailed biography of a Moscow nobleman Boris Nikiforovich Davydov, who began his service as a zhilets (tenant) at the court of Tsar Fyodor Ivanovich. During the reign of Boris Godunov, he was a voivode (governor) in Saratov (1603–1604) and was at war in Caucasus (1604–1605). Then he participated in the suppression of the Bolotnikov Rebellion, was at the service of False Dmitry II, took part in the liberation of Moscow in 1612. Under Mikhail Romanov, being the second commander of the Great Regiment in Tula, he took part in defense of Russia's southern borders (1616–1617), and then in the defense of Moscow from the troops of Władysław Vasa. B.N. Davydov died in 1624 serving as a voivode in Samara.

Boris M. Pudalov. Pyotr Stolypin's genealogical mistake.

Summary: P.A. Stolypin, when presenting a petition for his inclusion in the Nizhny Novgorod Genealogical Book of Nobility, Part 6, made a mistake in his own genealogy, incorrectly determining relation degree with M.V. Stolypin. The article analyzes possible reasons of this mistake and shows practices of officials in provincial noble deputy assemblies.

Mikhail N. Marov. Valuable genealogical source of the early 20th century: "The family tree of the Kolyubakins of all 14 branches of the genus".

Summary: The article describes an important document, a copy of which is stored in the State Archive of Tver region. It contains on one sheet a graphic image of the family tree of the Kolyubakin nobles and a genealogical table of fourteen branches of this family, which includes 712 persons. A proposition is substantiated about the drawer of the family tree and the genealogical table. The Kolyubakins' genealogical table from this document is also published here in full.

Sergej D. Garnyuk. Lev Borisovich Kamenev and his family.

Summary: The article examines the main stages of life of a prominent figure of the Bolshevik Party, L.B. Kamenev, with an emphasis on obscure and little-studied aspects of his biography. His family ties and the fate of people close to him are examined, too. The study clarifies L.B. Kamenev's date of birth and his religious identity.

The boyar book of 1629 (publication by Egor N. Gorbatov).

Summary: Boyar books are the most important sources of the Moscow monarchic court's history. These documents contain list of servicemen with indication of their land grant and salary and information about the salary changes. Boyar books were compiled in the Razryadny Prikaz (Order-in-charge) with regularity once every ten years throughout the 17th century. The books were created and maintained for registration of land grants and salaries of Moscow officials. This publication presents the previously unpublished boyar book compiled in 1629.

Genealogical registers submitted to the Chamber of genealogical affairs in the late 17th century: supplement (B, G, E, K-Ya) (publication by Leonid E. Shabaev).

This part completes publication of the entire complex of genealogical registers presented to the Chamber of genealogical affairs after the abolition of mestnichestvo in the late 17th century. It contains 74 registers of 69 families and supplements previous publications.

Landowners of Voronezh province according to information by 1867. Part 1 (Voronezhsky, Zemlyansky, Nizhnedevitsky, Ostrogozhsky, Korotoyasky, Pavlovsky uyezds) (compiled by Aleksandr N. Akinshin).

Summary: The directory contains data on all the landowners of Voronezh province by 1867, with indications of their names, location and size of their land holdings. Comments provide additional information about the persons included in the directory and about their family ties. The first part of the directory includes data on six uyezds.

Mihail Y. Katin-Yartsev. On the history of the corporation of Arzamas gentry.

Summary: The review deals with the set of materials about the corporation of the landowning servicemen of Arzamas uyezd in the 17th century, published by Boris M. Pudalov. These are acts of office work of prikazes and desyatni (lists of the gentry, fit and unfit for military service). These books give wide possibilities of studying military and social history, as well as genealogy of nobility.
