Egor N. Gorbatov. *The princes of Rostov under Mikhail Fyodorovich in the lists of boyars and zhil'tsy.*

Summary: The article presents the names of the Rostov princes discovered in the lists of boyars and zhil'tsy compiled during the reign of Mikhail Fyodorovich (1613–1645). The data from accounting documents and genealogical registers is compared. The kinship relations of the Rostov princes, as well as their connections with other families, are established. Biographies of the princes of Rostov are provided according to the materials from the boyar lists.

Key words: Rostov princes, boyar lists, lists of zhil'tsy, the Sovereign's court, nobility, boyars, genealogical registers.

"Authentic" lists of nobles and boyar scions from the fund of Razryadny Prikaz, deposited in the materials of the Sevsky office. Part 2 (1633 (?), 1635, 1644–1645, 1644–1646, 1649–1650) (publication by Leonid E. Shabaev).

Summary: This Part 2 of the publication of "authentic" name lists of nobles and boyar scions deposited in the materials of the Sevsky Office presents five lists for Aleksin, Odoev, Serpukhov, Solova, Tarusa, Tula and, partially, Vereya, Zvenigorod and Mozhaysk. These documents cover the period from 1633 to 1650.

Marital status and service of retired military men of Zamoskovny Krai in 1660–1661 according to their testimonies ("skazki") (publication by Vladimir A. Arakcheev).

Summary: This publication includes testimonies ("skazki") about marital status and service of retired military men and their sons, submitted in January 1661 and deposited in the archival fund of Razryadny Prikaz. The preface analyzes the structure and the average size of a noble family, outlines prospects for historical and genealogical research. The link between combat losses and the phenomenon of the prozhitok estates is also shown. The publication is accompanied with an index of names and places.

Petitions of "Moscow ranks" for retirement from regimental service, 1697 (publication by Valerij D. Kochetkov, Sergej V. Sirotkin).

Summary: The publication presents 544 petitions of service class people of the "Moscow rank" for retirement from regimental service, submitted to Razryadny Prikaz in 1697. These documents contain information about places and terms of the petitioners' service, about their injuries, wounds and illnesses, financial and marital status. This data is extremely important for historical and genealogical research.

Military and “spiritual” “cities” of Orenburg in the mid-18th century (according to the confession list of the Trinity Church) (compiled by Ol’ga A. Titova, Mihail Yu. El’kin).

Summary: The reference publication presents data from the confessional list of the Trinity Church in Orenburg. Dating back to 1752 (1753), it is probably the earliest one surviving in this city. It contains information about the clergy of the Trinity Church, of the Assumption Cathedral, the officers and lower ranks of Penza garrison regiment, about domestic servants and their family members. In total, the list includes data on more than 1940 persons.
