Mihail M. Bencianov. *The XIV–XVI centuries necrology from the Moscow Assumption cathedral. Principles and patterns of names' entry.*

Summary: Using the example of the necrology from the Moscow Assumption cathedral, the article raises the question of the ways individual names appeared in the lists for «eternal remembrance». Much attention is paid to analysis of this necrology as an “official” document, and to assessment of its distinction and its influence on local memorial lists, as well as its use by the ruling court elite for their own purposes.

Andrej V. Belyakov. *The princes and mirzas Yusupovy in Russia from the XVI century to the first half of the XVIII century (preliminary results).*

Summary: The article attempts to combine all the currently available scattered information on the genealogy of the princes / mirzas Yusupovy in Russia of the XVI–XVIII centuries. It is concluded that the well-established idea of the only one existing branch of the family in the XVIII–XIX centuries is erroneous. However, in the first half of the XVIII century there actually was a so-called “bottleneck”, drastically reducing the number of simultaneously living representatives of the family. The reasons for this are still unknown, but such a phenomenon is typical for many princely families of Eastern origin.

Veronika N. Belyaeva, Sergej V. Sirotkin. *Cum grano salis: Balakhna roots of the Milyutin family.*

Summary: The article deals with the genealogy of the Milyutin family in the XVII–XVIII centuries. Representatives of this family came from among the tradespeople of the city of Balakhna, and later found themselves in the Moscow merchant class and among the court servants. One of them received a hereditary nobility and his own coat of arms for merit. An extensive set of sources on the history and genealogy of the Milyutin family is published as the appendix to the article.

Rafael M. Abramyan. *On the history of Georgian Armenians' genealogy studies.*

Summary: This is the first attempt to overview the literature about genealogy of the Armenians of Georgia. The overview discusses not only publications of individual genealogical trees, but also genealogical works about different regions of the country. Main themes of publications are examined. The article includes bibliographic index of books in Russian, Armenian, Georgian, and European languages.

Genealogical registers submitted to the Chamber of genealogical affairs in the late 17th century: supplement (A-K) (publication by Leonid E. Shabaev).

Summary: This is a part of publication of the entire complex of genealogical registers presented to the Chamber of genealogical affairs after the abolition of mestnichestvo in the late 17th century. This part contains 63 registers of 58 noble families, supplying previous publications.

Service “cities” of Zamoskov’e Region and “Lithuanian Ukraine”: index of personnel of nobles and boyar scions by “desyatni” and lists of the 1620s – 1630s (compiled by Vyacheslav N. Kozlyakov).

Summary: This index contains the register of “desyatni” (military muster rolls) and lists, mainly related to the muster of 1630–1631. Data from these sources is structured according to general headings: last name, first name and patronymic, “city”, rank, land grant, salary. In total, the names of 7,500 noblemen and boyar scions are found in the registered “desyatni” and lists of service “cities” of Zamoskov’e Region and “Lithuanian Ukraine”. New information about hundreds of little-known noble families proves the importance of genealogical research based on the study of the lists of uyezd nobles’ and boyar scions’ names using the materials related to the military muster of 1630–1631.

Igor’ V. Saharov. On the publication of the next major work on domestic necropolistics.

Summary: The review deals with the Volume 3 of the series “Materials for the Russian Provincial Necropolis”, published in 2020, which includes the card-register of V. V. Sheremetevsky. At the same time, the review provides an overview of previously published volumes of “The Moscow Necropolis”, “The St. Petersburg Necropolis” and “The Russian Provincial Necropolis” – their advantages and disadvantages, as well as reflections on various aspects of Russian necropolistics.

Denis N. Shilov. New biographical dictionary about the Imperial Alexander Lyceum.

Summary: The review deals with the biographical dictionary of schoolmasters, students, and employees of the Imperial Alexander Lyceum, compiled by V. N. Rykhlyakov and published by the publishing house “Staraya Basmannaya” under the editorship of D. P. Shpilenko. It deals with the problems of selection and use of biographical sources, primarily archival materials. The publication’s structural features and difficulties of prepublishing of a biographical dictionary about thousands of persons are also considered.
